- Maintaining the CCGA Web Site: We have continued to meet and have training sessions for Sarah B. and Mamie G. to make posts and update the event calendar on the CCGA web site, as well as updating the mailing lists we use.
- Volunteer Management: We have looked at various tools to help us manage potential volunteers, most of the tools require a lot of event set-up for pre-planned events and allowing users time to sign up. We feel that our existing approach of recording volunteer responses in a worksheet and communicating with those potential volunteers when we have an event or opportunity is easiest to manage, with little extra work. But, we need to:
- o clean-up our volunteer sign-up pages and check the language;
- o send a follow-up email to those on the volunteer list and let them know they are on our volunteer list and we will contact them if an opportunity presents;
- o we need to let our garden leaders know that there is a large pool of potential volunteers for garden work projects.
- Garden Map/Connecting People with Gardens: I sent some copy much earlier this year that was intended to be published in our newsletter which detailed what additional elements we need from garden leaders to publish to the garden map. This includes a general garden email, garden website, garden Facebook page, garden Instagram site, etc.. Those items allow us to connect people to gardens. We need to send a separate email about this update to our main garden email list to have our garden map be accurate.
- MailChimp Account: We still need additional user accounts set-up in MailChimp. We cannot currently use the service to send emails, only Amy O. has a login for that vendor.
- Google Group/Listserv: Our garden forum works fine. We continually have people requesting to join the forum, sometimes 2-4 a month. There have not been many posts on the forum. I made a recent post about free compost and got some positive feedback so it works fine. You can access the forum through the site pages. I can think of several things we could do to promote the forum and allow easier access.

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
